

## New safety rules in Poland

From Saturday, 17 October, 2020 new safety rules will apply throughout **the whole country**:

- the restaurants can be open between 6:00 and 21:00. Every second table can be occupied. After 9 p.m., only take-away meals can be ordered;
- limited number of people in public transport - 50% of seats may be occupied or 30% of the total capacity of the vehicle;
- sporting events without an audience;
- in cultural events max. 25% of seats occupied by the audience;
- suspended activity of swimming pools, aquaparks and gyms.

Additionally:

- In the **yellow zone (whole country)**, except districts in the red zone, from Saturday, 17 October:
  - during religious ceremonies no more than 1 person per 4m<sup>2</sup>;
  - public gatherings may be attended by max. 25 people
  - hybrid teaching is obligatory in universities and secondary schools;
  - **from 19.10** - limited number of persons at weddings and other celebrations - max. 20 people, without the possibility of dancing;
- In the **red zone** (**Krakow is in the red zone!**), from Saturday, 17 October:
  - limiting the number of people in retail outlets to 5 people per 1 cash register;
  - during religious ceremonies no more than 1 person per 7m<sup>2</sup>
  - public gatherings may be attended by max 10 people;
  - remote teaching is obligatory in universities and secondary schools
  - **from 19.10** - ban on organizing special events (i.e. weddings);

**\*Warsaw, Gdańsk, Gdynia, Sopot, Poznań are also included in the red zone.**

The shopping hours (Monday-Friday, 10:00-12:00) for people aged over 60 years are maintain.
