FOR SENDING INSTITUTION

Apply through your home institution in the academic year before you wish to study at the Ignatianum. Each institution has its own procedures so please check it with your International Office.

Upon a successful application, your Univeristy informs us about your nomination by submitting an **ON-LINE NOMINATION FORM**

We do not accept applications from students who have not been officially nominated by their home university.

After our preliminary acceptance student is required to apply according to our procedures.

APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

FOR STUDENTS

- 1. Student Application Form
- 2. Learning Agreement for studies (LA)
- 3. Language Competence Proof (LCP)
- 4. Scan of **insurance** valid for your whole mobility period
- 5. Scan of your valid passport or valid ID card (ONLY EU citizens)
- 6. Scan of passport size photo IN GOOD QUALITY (jpg format)
- 7. Scan of Visa applicable for non-European Union citize
- 8.*<u>Additional formalities for non-European students within ICM</u> (Erasmus+ KA 107) exchange mobility with partner countries

Student apply to us by sending to **incoming@ignatianum.edu.pl** the **SCANS** of necessary documents

- Remember to name all files in a standard way: your surname_semester_document title (e.g.: Smith_winter_LA).
- Each document MUST be saved as a SEPARATE file.
- We kindly ask you to send all documents in ONE email.



After receiving all documents, an official Letter of Acceptance is issued and sent to you and your home university by email as a confirmation that you were accepted as a student at our university.







COURSES HELD IN FOREIGN LANGUAGES FOR EXCHANGE STUDENTS

The Jesuit University Ignatianum in Krakow consists of two faculties:

ECTS GRADING SYSTEM

Students may collect max 30 ECTS/ semester or 60 ECTS/ year to their Learning Agreement

Students may choose courses from all Institutes but are required to have majority of courses/ECTS at the host Institute, where his/her field (major) of study belongs

POLISH LANGUAGE COURSE

(practical activity/lectorate)

2 ECTS, 30 hours/semester



Jesuit University Ignatianum organizes for all the incoming exchange students a separate Polish Language Course for beginners, **free of charge.** The course awards them with a certificate of attendance, provided they regularly attended and successfully passed a final evaluation test.

INTERNSHIP

(practical activity)

5 ECTS, 60 hours/semester

Course addressed **ONLY** to students of Pedagogy and English Philology with the specialization in Primary School Education or Teaching English in High Schools.

The internship can be accomplished at nursery schools, primary schools, high schools and common rooms for children and youngs (public sitting rooms for the use of a group).

Our University cooperates with educational institutions so there is no need to find your internship on your own.

PRACTICAL INFORMATION

WELCOME DAYS

A week before the inauguration of the new semester (winter and summer) are organised 'Welcome Days' for foreign students who begin their studies at the Ignatianum. The first day of "Welcome Days" is the official beginning of student mobility in the Ignatianum. Attendance on all days is obligatory.



POLISH STUDENT ID



The exchange incoming Students are provided with the Polish Student ID.

How and when will I get it?

Once you pay for your student ID, you receive it at your secretariat.

How much does it cost?

22 pln

Where to use it?

Having a Polish student's ID means that you belong to the university community and you have the same rights and obligations as Polish students.

In Poland students have lots of discounts with their valid ID (public transport, museums, access to libraries, etc.)

The ID can also be used as a monthly ticket for public transport in Krakow.

Wherever you go in Poland, ask if you have a discount with your ID

VISA

If you are a non-European Union citizen you might need a visa to enter the territory of Poland. You obtain the visa from the consulate of Poland in your country of residence.

Our Office issues an official Letter of Invitation for students who need visa.

INSURANCE



European Union citizen

Students from EU should obtain the European Health Insurance Card (EHIC). Apart from that, we also highly advice to get a private insurance which covers the following:

- Civil liability
- Accidents and serious illness (including temporal and permanent disability)
- Death and repatriation

non-European Union citizen

Non-European students need to get a private insurance which covers the following:

- Medical treatment and hospitalization following illness or accident
- Civil liability
- Accidents and serious illness (including temporal and permanent disability)
- Death and repatriation

COVID-19 - additional insurance for students

An additional insurance which covers a medical treatment in case of covid19 contagion is required. The EHIC provides the basic care only. Therefore students are asked to buy an insurance which guaranties a refund of a covid19 hospitalization.

The insurance must be obtain before students arrival to Poland.

STUDENT MENTOR

Moving to another country may be a stressful experience. But you don't need to worry because every student who comes to our university can count on his/her Mentor – a Polish student who will help you at your arrival, show you around during the first days and generally will be helping you with all those practical issues during your stay in Poland. A Mentor is your link to the local environment.
